The European Commission will launch its Fifth Call for ICT proposals on 31 July 2009. This will include **147 M€** for research into Objectives “**Internet of Services, Software & Virtualization**” and “**Internet of Things and Enterprise Environments**”.

Presentations from the European Commission will enable delegates to understand the scope of the call in detail – essential information for success. Requirements for partnering and writing winning proposals will be addressed. These elements together with a keynote speaker from the **NESSI** (Networked European Software & Services Initiative) organisation to provide an overview perspective on the Software and Services elements, make this an event not to be missed.

Participants will also be able to register their intent and ideas in preparation for a follow up workshop looking at specific outline proposals

The full day event will also include opportunities to discuss individual ideas with experts from the KTN's as well as advice on forming consortia.

The Digital Communications Knowledge Transfer Network has been established by an industry-led group of leading players, with funding from the Technology Strategy Board. It seeks to bring competitive advantage to the UK by promoting collaboration and knowledge sharing between the users and providers of Digital Communications, and by helping to drive innovation in the sector.
